




PACE surveyed a **nationally representative sample of 5000 registered voters** and asked about their perceptions and associations of 21 terms often used in civic engagement and democracy work. In collaboration with the Arizona Center for Civic Leadership and the Center for the Future of Arizona, Vitalyst Health Foundation sponsored an oversample of this data to look more closely at how Arizona residents, specifically, perceive and associate civic language.



For each term, the positivity score of one group listed below (e.g., older) was subtracted from the other group listed (e.g., younger). The absolute values of these differences were averaged across all terms. This average difference score is shown for each comparison (e.g., older & younger).




Which civic terms do various Arizona subgroups gravitate to most?


Below, the top three positively ranked civic terms are listed next to each subgroup.
